Cover: The tobacco hawkmoth (*Manduca sexta*) provides a complementary bioassay for identifying compounds that might reduce the effects of dysregulated Ca^{2+} homeostasis associated with Alzheimer's disease (AD). This bioassay was combined with three others (a neuroblastoma model of amyloid toxicity, a *Drosophila* model and a transgenic mouse model of AD) to test whether dihydropyridines are protective against the neurotoxic effects of β -amyloid.
